Hence, international law is no more 'law' than is constitutional law or even criminal law. As John Austin stated, both constitutional and international law are merely 'positive morality' [FN3] [pg1295]. One might object and say that it is frivolous to exclude the vast body of constitutional law and criminal law cases from what we mean.
