Why we care: If your audience didn't hear you, you didn't deliver your message What we can do: Use what you learn in this webinar to speak so everyone listens by 1) undoing your own communication biases, 2) identifying the preferred communication style(s) of your audience, and 3) tailoring your message to deliver the information people

UNDERSTANDING YOUR AUDIENCE Whenever you speak, you encounter varying audiences There are several ways of identifying the attributes of a group Recognizing characteristics allows you to better connect with your audience DEMOGRAPHIC VARIABLES When possible, know the demographics of your audience before you select your topic

- Be enthusiastic about your topic
- Talk to your audience in a friendly, conversational manner
- Know your subject but do not memorize
- Look at your audience (eye contact) as you speak and demonstrate
- Keep your chin up so your voice will carry well
- Speak loud enough to be heard

Pronounce words correctly and clearly

When you speak too quickly, the audience may have a hard time keeping up with what you are saying and will have difficulty comprehending your speech If you speak too slowly, the audience may get bored and restless, losing attention fast Catchy title - The title lets the audience know what the speech is about before you start

### **A.U.D.I.E.N.C.E. Analysis (It's Your Key To Success)**

prepared speech given to the correct audience They both can fail terribly It is critical that your preparation efforts include some amount of audience analysis The more you know and understand about your audience and their needs, the better you can prepare your speech to ...

if you want to approach your subject from a different angle and discuss, for instance, the social, economic, and political effects of Hurricane Katrina, a topical organization would better suit your needs And if you want to inform your audience why Hurricane Katrina proved so destructive to the city of New Orleans, you would choose a causal order

### **Audience Mapping: The Why, How and What to Look For**

Significant gaps between levels of awareness and support for the same audience ("soft supporters" and "aware skeptics") Audiences that are more supportive of your efforts than aware of what they are about can undermine your campaign's credibility if they speak out without knowing the full story

Your movement from your seat to the lectern or podium is actually the beginning of your presentation and the first opportunity to use body language
