Rising Tensions Between the American Colonies & Britain

The Boston Tea Party •To protest the Tea Act the Sons of Liberty, disguised as Natives, snuck aboard 3 cargo ships at anchor in Boston Harbor on December 16,1773 •They dumped 90,000 pounds of tea into the harbor •British East Indian Tea Company and British Parliament were VERY UPSET!
