Four Critical Components of an Effective Writing-Process Approach to Teaching Written Expression: TIME $\frac{3}{4}$ Students need to write often and regularly (at least 4 days per week for 60 minutes) $\frac{3}{4}$ Students need opportunities for sustained writing $\frac{3}{4}$ There should be a balance of time spent in secretary role and author role—Do not emphasize one role over the
